# TIN CAN BAY CAMERA CLUB 2019 ANNUAL RETREAT – BUNYA MOUNTAINS

On Monday 9th September, 15 TCBCC members packed our camera bags and headed for the Bunya Mountains for five days of fun and photography frivolity. Ten members stayed in a rented holiday chalet at Dandabah, while 5 members towed caravans and camped at the nearby campground.

On the way to the Bunyas, we stopped at the Wooroolin Wetlands near Kingaroy, but with the drought and lack of rain, these were more "drylands" with not a drop of water remaining

in the wetlands. Another stop was made in Kingaroy to photograph the massive peanut silos. Too bad if you didn't like roasted peanuts - the smell was everywhere!

Upon arrival at Dandabah, we settled into our rented holiday chalet. While it was early spring, it was bitterly cold with a gusty gale-force south west wind blowing that made getting a fire going in the wood burner a priority! But despite the chilly temperatures, the weather was fine with clear, though smoke-filled skies from bushfires burning further south on the Sunshine Coast, Scenic Rim and Granite Belt.

Members spent the week enjoying the national park photographing birds, nature and landscapes. Sadly, the lack of rain mean the rainforest streams and waterfalls were reduced to little more than a trickle, but there was sufficient water to sustain the wildlife ... and there was plenty of that to see and photograph. From tiny forest birds such as Eastern Yellow Robins, Fairy Wrens, Bowerbirds, King Parrots, Rosellas and Currawongs, to butterflies and roaming wallabies with their joeys, no one was disappointed by the diversity of subjects on offer.

Members also participated in organised workshops, including Window Light Portraiture, Still

Life by Window Light, Lensball Landscapes and Lensball Light Painting.

At every annual retreat, a challenge subject is chosen and retreat participants are asked to submit one photo - their best or favourite - of the subject. This year's Challenge subject was "Joeys" which ensured everyone spent time chasing joeys to get their best photo.




Fisher's Lookout Sunset






There are also interesting mangroves nearby hiding plenty of macro opportunities, and maybe even migratory seabirds in Toondah Harbour if the tide is coming in.


